ASSET (Assessment of Scholastic Skills through Educational Testing) scientifically designed skill-based assessment. designed Educational by Initiatives, a group founded by IIM(A)alumni. This test focuses on measuring how well SKILLS and CONCEPTS have been understood by the student in each subject domain and provides information weaknesses the strengths and of on individual students.

At AAIS, the students of Grades 3 to 10 appeared for this test from December 13th to 15th in English, Maths and Science.

Once the results are declared, students who receive a 'distinction' or 'outstanding' look forward to a second round of tests which is a talent based examination – the ATS (Asset Talent Search) that gives them opportunities to take up programmes in different parts of the country.



PARENT ORIENTATION SESSIONS:



At AAIS, we strongly believe that parents play a pivotal role in the student's academic and all-round development. The school offers parent orientation sessions periodically to keep parents updated of the various aspects of the student's schooling.

In keeping with the practice, a synopsis of the AS/A Level and the IBDP programmes were provided to the parents of the grade 10 students, and the parents of the grade 8 students were briefed on the subjects available for the two years of the IGCSE. The orientation sessions were conducted in order to ensure that an informed choice can be made for the learners in the paths that they take up further in their academic journeys at AAIS.







SERVICE INITIATIVE



INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS OLYMPIAD:

Our learners of the Diploma Program have proved it yet again on a global stage.

Out of 16 countries, 26 teams and 129 students of competitors, 4 the **IBDP ECR** program from оиг campus participated in the International Business Olympiad, 2021, evaluated by a jury of eminent Economics & Business scholars. The Jury Committee consisted of experts in the Business field from prestigious universities like Harvard Business School and Imperial college Business school.

The participants took part in individual and group categories. In the individual category we had two students who secured first place and the 18th place globally. Akshar Arbol also bagged the second place for Case Analysis team activity on a Global scale.

Ayush expressed that his experience motivated him to learn more. It enabled him to go in depth and explore his favourite subject..



RISING MATHEMATICIAN OLYMPIAD

As our middle schoolers meet us back in the physical school, they have brought along a few laurels to share. Achyut Dinesh and Avyukt Dinesh from Grade 7 made it to the top 50 in the ROOTS 2021, The Rising Mathematician Olympiad conducted on October 31st 2021.

The boys were among the top 50 to be selected for the free Math Camp with scholarship that was conducted by eminent professors in Math and Applied Science. They shared that it was a fun learning marathon for over 20 hours (11th November - 15th November 2021)

Achyut and Avyukt also participated in the PiVerb math Olympiad and came in 1st and 3rd respectively in 6th and 7th Category. The Olympiad was conducted in September 2021 This Olympiad had Non Routine Math problems and pan India. There were around 850 participants.
