




CRS FOR HIGH SCHOOL






IN THE MONTH OF OCTOBER 2022...

In collaboration with the National Council for Science Museums (NCSM), movies were screened based on age appropriate issues and topics. Films that were shown included a short film titled "Every Child is a Scientist" and "Microplastics".

The first was aimed at making students understand that the scientific process was one that can be implemented at any age and was not restricted to labs and adults.

The second discussed an issue that has massive environmental impact, that of microplastics and the risks that they pose to the environment.

The shorts promoted science literacy, a glimpse into alternative realities and also aided the exploration of vital issues and themes.

A follow-up discussion included thoughtful reflections on the students' understanding of the earth around us.






THE FICTION EXPRESS – READING PLATFORM READ – ENGAGE – CONTRIBUTE

A novel addition to the learning of English as a subject is the introduction of the reading platform of "Fiction Express". This is a pilot project for the students of grades 6 & 7, where students not only get an opportunity to read more books but also get to contribute to the making of a novel.

This initiative has been taken especially to encourage and inculcate reading habits in our middle schoolers, so that they are able to appreciate the subject better, and are parallelly ready for the different challenges with the English language in the future. Students are encouraged to read and present their opinion on this platform, and they are also able to check on the discussions and viewpoints of the other students from the different parts of the globe. There are exercises and activities that assist the understanding of students. The English Department monitors the students' engagement and progress.

Students have started reading titles available in the portal including finished books. They have also begun contributing to the 'live books' that are still in the process of being completed.





COLLEGE COUNSELLING

The Career & College Counselling programme aims to give students of Grade 8 and above a peek into various career possibilities and professions that exist to equip them with the right information as they stand to choose subjects and courses of study. The second session was held on December 3rd on careers in Finance. Mr. Shriram Ananthanarayanan, Managing Director of Oakwhite Partners and Mr. Karthik Sundaram, Director, Ad Infinitum Finvest Services, both parents of our students were invited to share their journey and expertise in the field of accounting and finance.

They were given a rundown of the jobs and opportunities available in the sector and tips on how to pursue a career in the space. The students enjoyed getting their doubts clarified and interacting with the guest speakers.

The initiative was undertaken to support a project by our IB DP students who wanted to make bio-enzyme using orange peel. The intention was to collect as much fresh orange f=peel as possible. The faculty and students also demonstrated how to kick start the process of making the bio-enzymes.

It was a thrilling experience for the students of grades 8 and 9 to be invited by The American Center Chennai to visit the Full-scale model of Nasa's Mars Rover "Opportunity"! Built by Cornell University students, the full scale model was displayed at the Smithsonian's Air and Space Museum in Washington D.C. and was sent as an exhibit piece at the U.S.A. Pavilion during the Dubai Expo 2020 from October 1, 2021, to March 31, 2022.

This unique exhibit highlights American achievement in Space technology and our collective sense of wonder! Space related activities were curated to engage students and stoke their curiosity! Students were taken on a guided group visit on a space adventure!
